<u>To prepare for class</u>, you will need to complete the knitted project you have chosen with 7 additional stitches (for steeking). Part of the class will be instruction on creating a button band for your project after steeking.

<u>How To Add 7 Stitches</u>: When casting on, cast on the number of stitches that your pattern calls for then place a BOR marker, cast on 7 additional stitches and place another marker before joining in the round. These will be your steeking stitches

Every round: When you reach the 7 steek stitches on each round, you will slip the BOR marker, knit stitches 1, 3, 5, 7 in the Main Color and knit stitches 2, 4, 6 in the Contrast Color per the chart pictured below. Continue in this way throughout the entire pattern and then bind off your project.
